Training Descriptions

Caring for a Child with Seizures/Diastat Administration

This workshop will provide child care providers with the tools needed to handle a seizure emergency. Every child with seizures should have a Seizure Care Plan and knowledgeable staff in the classroom. This training will prepare staff to remain calm and assist as needed with this emergency.

Communicable Diseases in Child Care

There are a number of steps which providers and staff of child care homes and centers can take to prevent or reduce the incidents of illness among children and adults in the child care setting. Learn the differences of common infectious diseases and common nuisance diseases.

Incredible Years for Teachers Classroom Management

The training is focused on strengthening teacher classroom management strategies, promoting children's prosocial behavior and school readiness (reading skills), and reducing classroom aggression and noncooperation with peers and teachers. Additionally the class focuses on ways teachers can effectively collaborate with parents to support their school involvement and promote consistency from home to school.

Introduction to Online Learning: Early Childhood Providers

This two-hour training is designed to assist providers in getting started in the ACC online environment, student/instructor expectations, online student success tips, WebAdvisor and Access email activation, and Moodle navigation. This training will be extremely beneficial, but not limited to those who have never taken an online course before.

Partnering With Families Of School Age Children – 2 DCDEE Contact Hours

When school age children come to your program they come attached to a family unit. Learning to create partnerships with children's families will help you provide the best service to all children. Learn to communicate successfully with parents, how to set up your relationship for success and what to do when challenges arise.

Please, Teach Me What To Do

Learning new skills is hard, and when you're a preschooler every skill is new. Learning to manage your own behavior can be the hardest skill of all. Teaching self-management can be an intensive process, but it's a skill that is crucial to kindergarten readiness. When children can navigate the classroom with minimal adult assistance, they learn to take ownership of their own actions and choices, they treat others better, and are better able to calm themselves and to problem solve. Come learn the five steps to teaching self-management skills so you and your children can reap the benefits.

Preventing Power Struggles with Preschoolers

We all want to be in control of our own lives. But young children usually have very few opportunities to make choices about what they do and when they do it. They're told when to get up, what to wear, what to eat and when to eat it, where to go and what to do when they get there. Introducing choice into a young child's life can be a powerful tool to promote improved behavior in your classroom. Come learn the five steps to using the choice making strategy and discover how easily you can embed choice-making opportunities into your classroom and short-circuit power struggles with your preschoolers.

Recognizing and Responding to the Ill Child

Familiarize child care providers with common signs and symptoms that children may develop when they have infectious diseases, and the diseases that commonly are associated with them. Educate child care providers when medical attention is required. Discuss when exclusion from child care is indicated, and readmission permitted. How to perform an effective daily morning health check will be covered. Developing effective policies for illness and exclusion will be discussed.
