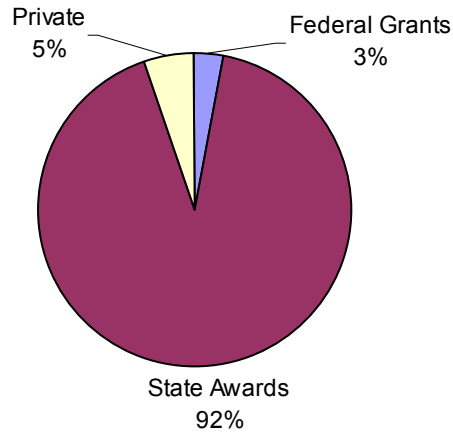
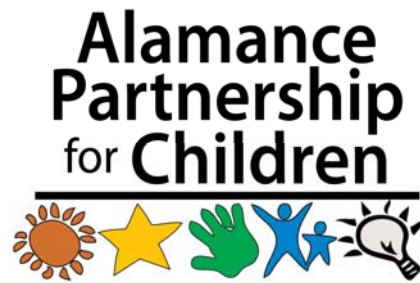


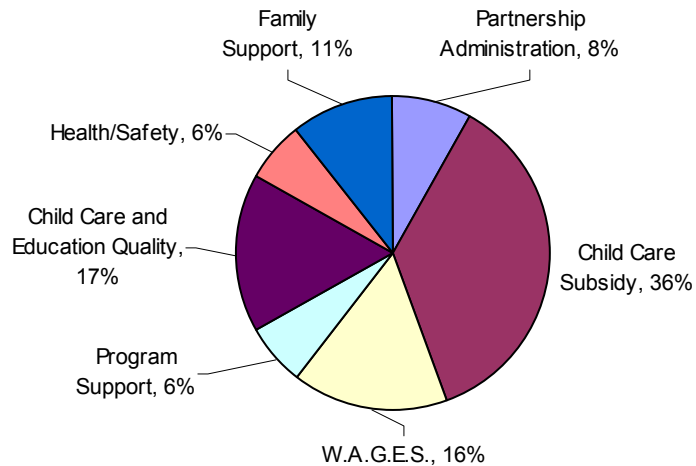
Fiscal Year 2007-2008

2007-2008 Alamance County Facts

Total number of children birth to five: **9,739***

Family Services



- **16** children and their families, at 11 child care facilities, received intensive behavioral intervention services.
- **504%** increase in number of families on publication's distribution list.
- **65** parents and **84** children received intensive family support through the Parents as Teachers program.
- **100%** of parents participating in the Parents as Teachers program received a referral to another community resource.

Literacy

A Family Services Initiative



- **285** children are signed up to receive books through the Dolly Parton Imagination Library .
- **2671** children participated in the Reach Out and Read program.
- **23** families participated in the Motherread program.

2991 Children aged 0-5 enrolled in regulated child care

104 Child Care Facilities operating in Alamance County

61% of Child Care Facilities rated three stars or higher

Child care services

- **50** child care facilities received intensive technical assistance and/or general support to help raise or maintain their star rated licensure.
- **76%** of child care providers who applied for increased licensure and were receiving technical assistance from the Partnership succeeded in raising their star rated licenses.
- **255** child care providers received a salary supplement through the WAGE\$ program, which is funded by the Alamance Partnership for Children.
- **522** families received child care referrals and were directed toward selecting high-quality child care.



Health Initiatives

- **256** child care providers received health and safety related trainings. More than **1800** children were indirectly effected by these services.
- **86** families received health training and/or consultation services.
- **74%** of health care providers in Alamance County who serve children are now using an approved developmental screening tool during well-child visits.
